The Lanarkshire Open took place at Alistair McCoist Complex in East Kilbride, South Lanarkshire over 14th & 15th September. Although entries were slightly down on last year the standard of play had not lessened .

For second year, the Gents singles was won by Ciar Pringle who defeated Finlay Jack retaining his title from 2023. It is very close battle between both players however Pringle managed to edge the win 21-18, 21-19. Woods won this event in 2022, runner up last year and was pleased to win the title again. She then teamed up with Evan Kenny to take the Mixed Doubles win over Katrina Chan & Lewis Coghill. Woods reflected on her successful weekend:
